An exciting opportunity has arisen for a Support Worker at our new U-Nite Clubz supported by Global Make Some Noise!

U-Nite Clubz is a brand new social club for disabled young adults aimed at helping them to get out, make friends and enjoy themselves. Often disabled young people have limited opportunities to be with friends and take part in all the social events others may enjoy. Experiences like going to gigs, festivals staying out late beyond 9pm are few and far between. We want you to help us change that!

The young adults will choose and plan trips, activities and events that they want to attend in the local area and further afield. The group will meet two evenings a month and two Saturdays a month and they will be able to choose which sessions interest them and sign up.

You will be a member of a small team providing high quality care and opportunities for disabled young adults aged 18-25years. You will build and maintain strong partnerships working with parents, carers and external professionals to ensure the young adult's needs are met. You will work with the young adults to enable independence and develop confidence and share your enthusiasm and skills in developing and participating in projects. You will have regular planning meetings with the team and will actively participate in creating a programme of activities.

You will provide a safe, stimulating environment for young adults which caters for their recreational, social, emotional and physical needs through the provision of a high quality service. You will have an active role in the transporting of the young adults as necessary ensuring that MiDAS training is being applied.

You will take appropriate steps to safeguard the confidentiality of all service user information and records.

At all times you will ensure that the charity's Policies and Procedures are implemented.
